The Butte County Fire Safe Council (BCFSC) is pleased to announce a Forest Health & Fuels Reduction Project in the community of Cohasset, Ca. This collaborative effort, supported by the California Climate Investment (CCI), is an example of our desire to mitigate wildfire risks and promote forest health practices throughout Butte County.

Set to commence in July 2024, this project will provide fuels reduction efforts within a rural community landscape. Through the strategic application of fuels reduction techniques, our
