Our No-Cost Chipper Program is Back!

Do you have overgrown brush or vegetation? The Chipper Program is a no-cost service for Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) residents who are working on their defensible space and wildfire safety. Chipping is an alternative to burning or removing fire-hazardous brush yourself. You stack it, we chip it!

To prepare brush and limbs for the Chipper Program:

1. Stack cut brush and limbs in a row within 5 feet of the road edge with the ends facing towards the road.
2. Rows should be stacked no more than 4 feet high and 10 feet in length.
3. Keep mud, rocks, and roots out of the rows.
4. Position the rows so the truck and chipper can easily access them. No off-road locations allowed.
