

Press Release Our No-Cost Chipper Program is Back!

Do you have overgrown brush or vegetation? The Chipper Program is a no-cost service for Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) residents who are working on their defensible space and wildfire safety. Chipping is an alternative to burning or removing fire-hazardous brush yourself. You stack it, we chip it!

To prepare brush and limbs for the Chipper Program:

- 1. Stack cut brush and limbs in a row within 5 feet of the road edge with the ends facing towards the road.
- 2. Rows should be stacked no more than 4 feet high and 10 feet in length.
- 3. Keep mud, rocks, and roots out of the rows.
- 4. Position the rows so the truck and chipper can easily access them. <u>No off-road</u> <u>locations allowed.</u>
