Forest Health Tours – Prescribed Fire in Forest Ranch

Join community members on a tour of Forests in the Big Chico Creek Canyon and Forest Ranch as they collaborate with Federal, State and local partners to explore forest health methods with a special focus on Prescribed Fire. The Butte County Fire Safe Council, a non-profit community organization, will be hosting a series of tours to demonstrate and promote practices that increase the resiliency of forested landscapes.

When & Who:

The tour series will kick-off Friday, May 21st along Hwy 32, visiting sites where prescribed fire is being used to reduce hazardous fuels and encourage the return to the historic condition that was widespread across the Sierra Foothills and beyond for centuries. Representatives from the Butte County Fire Safe Council, Forest Ranch Fire Safe Council, Big Chico Creek Ecological Reserve, Butte County Resource Conservation District and Bureau of Land Management will offer information for community members.
