## REDI Jedi Master Program Now Available

A new wildfire education program is available for Butte County educators and beyond! The Butte County Fire Safe Council, a non-profit community organization, partnered with Pyrosketchology to create a guide to nature journaling to deepen observation skills and awareness of the changing

conditions that influence wildfire.

The guide supports a program called the REDI Jedi Master which helps students learn how to observe and journal the seen and unseen forces that influence wildfire. Although intended to support teachers and programs with 6<sup>th</sup>-grade students or older, it can also be used to educate families in outdoor recreation and informal education settings.

The REDI guide can be used as companion curricula to the Wildfire in the Foothills 6<sup>th</sup>-grade program and Ready-Set-Go wildfire education programs.

There are nine lessons in the guide which includes a mix of fire science information, field observation exercises, and nature journaling and sketching techniques.

- Landscape Patterns, Patches and Fire
- Nature-Informed Landscape Position
- Seasons, Stages, and Fire
- Terrain, Heat Transfer, and Fire Rate of Spread
- Weather (Wind) and Fire Behavior
- Plant Moisture and Fire Combustion
- Vegetation Arrangement and Fire Behavior
- Plant and Animal Signs: Fire and Heat Indicators
- Illuminating Fire Practices: Place-based Knowledge
